Altieri's portfolio highlights our significant experience designing information technology (IT) systems across an array of project types including large-scale campus programs such as The National WWII Museum and K-12 independent school programs such as The Spence School.

THE NATIONAL WWII MUSEUM

The National WWII Museum is a military history museum dedicated to the American experience in World War II. It opened on June 6, 2000, the 56th anniversary of D-Day and is affiliated with the Smithsonian Institution. The multi-phase project will comprise ten buildings when completed. **Altieri** has been and continues to be involved in every phase of the project. Complex IT systems, interactive exhibitions, and infrastructure have been designed to serve the entire campus with particular attention paid to facilitating multi-phased expansion. All buildings are interconnected with fiber optic cabling providing redundancy, load balancing, and scalability. Special design considerations have resulted in all critical IT rooms being placed at higher elevation.

THE SPENCE SCHOOL

The Spence School has been a nationally-recognized leader in the education of girls and young women since its founding in 1892. The purchase of an adjacent townhouse provided an opportunity to create a unified campus while maintaining a distinct identity for Middle and Upper Schools. **Altieri** designed IT systems to serve the entire renovation in six phases over a three-year period. Providing a connection between the two buildings enabled unified network operations and ease of operations for the school. The connection also enabled phased construction minimizing down time for students and staff.
